Contributions to DIXIT

To make DIXIT another beautiful and appealing issue, we are looking for authors who want to share their knowledge, experiences and vision in this field with DIXIT readers. We aim for a total of about 15 different articles. Because of your expertise in the field of , we would like to ask you if you would like to write an article on for this DIXIT.

Would you let us know before 23 July if you would like to do so?

What does an article in the DIXIT look like?

The articles must meet a number of requirements: they should be easy-to-read pieces of 1 to 3 pages without too much jargon, and they should not be disguised commercials. For the articles, we are thinking of about 450 words per page (so max 1200 words for a 3-page article).

As editors, we will of course read every contribution carefully and undoubtedly come back to you with questions and comments. Before we publish your article, you will receive the latest version to approve or reject.



Illustrations

Very important: A nice article cannot do without nice graphics and/or photos with, of course, a sensible explanation. Photos should have a resolution of at least 300 dpi at full size to ensure the quality of the paper edition of the DIXIT.

Deadline

For contributions, we apply a deadline of 15 September for a first draft.
